He's been playing the role of John Steed in the "Avengers" since the very start of the series way back in the '60's. And Patrick now has everything worked out just right. When the last series was in

is nothing, "he modestly claims, "I know for a fact that David Niven walks twenty miles a day!"

Patrick Macnee's always been an actor. He was born in London and his father was a famous horse trainer, "Shrimp" Macnee. Patrick also has the distinction of being the first ever actor to appear on Canadian television way back in 1952.

Want to know what Patrick Macnee and Gareth Hunt share in common? they were both in the Navy when they were younger. But Patrick was in the Royal Navy and Gareth spent six years in the Merchant Navy. And it was while he was spending his time aboard ship that Gareth says he had a brush with his first real life adventure.

"I was seventeen at the time," Gareth recalled, "and our boat was in the Bay of Biscay.

"Suddenly, a wild, raging storm blew up and the boat became uncontrollable, buffeting about in the wind and sea. I was sure we'd had it! I couldn't see a way out for us and I was just terrified. Like anyone must who finds themselves in this situation I prayed. And I promised myself that if I survived I'd write home to my mother more often.

"Once you've come so close to the other side things never seem quite the same again."

Which is why, perhaps, Gareth has the attitude to take life as it comes.

He sees acting as just another job and his success in both "Upstairs, Downstairs" and the "Avengers". hasn't given him any notion that he's now a 'superstar'.

"I don't want to be a sex symbol," Gareth told us, "it's not my scene. I don't enjoy the publicity bit or being recognised. On TV, you're to a certain extent the product of the public.

"In any case, the fact that I'm acting in a successful series doesn't mean to say that T've arrived'. It's just a stepping stone to something else. I'd like to be a director and I'd like to write. I may do all this later."

Gareth is also a very private, retiring person. He's spent his leisure hours in the last two years re-decorating a large, old house he bought in Putney, London. If he says he enjoys staying at home then Gareth also admits to being a good cook. His favourite recipe is sausage casserole!

Success for the "Avengers" must have meant more money in the bank for all three stars, yet not one of them seems to have any outward show of it. Gareth drives around in a Beetle car. "Even if I had the money," he told us, "I'd never go in for buying something like a Rolls Royce. For a start, you'd never be able to park it in London! And a Rolls would use up so much petrol, too!"

Joanna herself only drives a Mini. "I do quite a lot of walking as well."

Joanna lives in the South West London area and there's a story of how, one day, she just decided that she needed a long walk. So she slammed out of the house, without taking anything with her, to have a long stroll.

However, after a few miles she soon wore herself out and decided she'd take a bus home. Only one thing was wrong though! She'd forgotten her purse and didn't have any money on her to get home!

In the series, Joanna does a lot of the falls, roof top jumps, car skidding and motor cycle riding herself. "It really was hard at first," she recalled, "especially as I suffer from vertigo!"

Joanna is also as settled in her home life as both Patrick Macnee and Gareth Hunt. She feels that she did all there was to do back in the Swinging Sixties.

Between acting assignments Joanna 'drifted' into modelling work — and found herself overnight fame as a 'Face Of The Sixties'.

She was married very briefly for eight months when she was twenty-one and always says now that she'll think very hard before doing that again. Among the many famous people who've dated her have been Rod Stewart and Patrick Lichfield!

There's one point that seems to be clear about all three stars from the "New Avengers". All of them take their work very seriously and not one of them seems to be affected by the title 'superstar'.

After all, as Gareth put it, acting is just a job, like any other.
